COOL VINES, GREAT WINES

Opawa means "smoky river" in the Maori language. Opawa wines, produced by Nautilus Estate, are named after the morning mist which collects along river valleys, keeping vines cool through summer and enhancing the flavour development of grapes grown on these stony valley soils.

Opawa wines received a clean sweep of gold medals at the Perth Royal Wine Show last month. The successful wines were Opawa Sauvignon Blanc 2010, Opawa Pinot Gris 2010 and Opawa Pinot Noir 2008.

Winemaker Brett Bermingham believes the intense aromas are key to the wines' appeal, outclassing many entries considerably more expensive, while offering tremendous value.
